A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIP



Happy New Year!

I was really taken with a story I recently ran across as told by fellow United Methodist minister Rev. King Duncan. Truth be told, I laughed myself silly! It seems that Steven was a young man who felt the call of God on his life. He came from a close family who grew up together in a small, rural Methodist congregation. He finished college and then went off to seminary. After finishing seminary he came back home while he was waiting for the bishop to appoint him to his first pastorate.

He visited with his relatives who were all equally proud of the ministerial vocation he had embraced. He stopped by the church and talked to his hometown pastor. The pastor asked him if he would like to preach that upcoming Sunday. Steven felt honored and took the pastor up on the invitation. Sunday morning came and after hours of nervous preparation he stepped up behind the pulpit, looked out at the congregation of smiling friends and family and began to share his well hewn sermon.

He had only preached for a few minutes, when his young niece, Kathleen, about six years old, stepped out into the center aisle and put her hands on her hips, cocked her head to one side, and declared in a very loud and clear voice, "Uncle Steven, you don't know what you are talking about!"

I don't know how Uncle Steven finished that sermon, but I have no doubt it was an experience that would stay with him for a long time! I identify with this story because I know what it is to be fresh out of seminary and just beginning my ministry and going back home to preach at the church I was reared in. It is not easy and highly intimidating because it is arduous to impress the home crowd. The outside world may think your preaching is the best thing since sliced bread, but down home, folks see you as that mischievous kid who inadvertently set the paraments on fire that one Sunday!

So, let's be honest. There is just so much that we don't know, even though we talk about it. We don't know what this year will hold when it comes to our health, our jobs and careers, retirement, and the future of our families, just to name a few. It can all be so overwhelming, not to mention discouraging. Our failures, letdowns, and disappointments all make for heavy baggage that many tend to carry with them through life. But there is a power-source available to each of us that can enable us to get up, get over it, and get on with our spiritual journey.

Following the first Sunday in January known as The Epiphany when we commemorate the visit of the Magi in the culmination of Christmastide, on January 12th we will introduce a new sermon series for the New Year entitled **The Power of the Plus Factor:** What It Is, and Why You Need It!

I assure you that this "plus factor" will set 2025 on the right path for you! To find out what "it" – the Plus Factor – is, be in worship on January 12!

MISSIONS UPDATES

Many friends and neighbors had their world turned upside down three months ago when Hurricane Helene zipped through East Tennessee and Western North Carolina. The catastrophic flooding it caused left a path of death and destruction. Power outages, road closures, and boil water advisories meant many families were isolated with no power, internet, or cellular service for weeks. Except for the hardest-to-reach areas, most families and businesses have had their power restored and water boil advisories lifted. Efforts are now focused on getting families back in their homes.

The Munsey Flood Recovery Task Force continues to find the best way for our church to be a part of these rebuilding efforts. Dave Culberson met with Caleb Frazier, director of the Wesley Foundation at ETSU and member of Embreeville UMC, in December and learned that a local Baptist church has purchased land where three Embreeville UMC families will have new homes built by Appalachia Service Project (ASP). The Christmas Eve Offering will be used by ASP to build new homes for these families and others in our community.
